

Property Committee Highlights

- Met with a technician from Burkholder's to complete the wiring of the A/C air handlers reset switches. Now they should automatically reset when the electricity goes off.
- We picked up sixteen 50 lb. bags of salt to be used on the pavements around the Church to help with the clearing of the snow and ice.
- Opened blocking sink drain in the restroom near the Church office.
- We continue with the repairs of several heating zones throughout the Church buildings.
- Scheduling with Paul Wright Roofing to replace the leaking roof on the South tower.
- Met with the estimator from Protect Alarms to work up a proposal for a much-needed update to the office security system. They can no longer get parts for our outdated system.
- Thanks to Carol Mayers for connecting us with a snow plowing and salting vendor to take care of clearing the parking lot this winter season.

Pastors or deacons of the Collaborative Churches will facilitate the Bible studies. Lunch will be supplied each week by one or two of those Churches.


